Professor Carlo Ratti is one of today's leading voices on architectural innovation, urban design, and the use of technology to make cities more liveable, sustainable, and equitable.

In this talk, he will explore how artificial intelligence can help us reimagine the public realm — not through abstract models, but through tangible experiments that measure and enhance the ways we live, move, and interact. From analysing how people respond to temporary interventions (like seating, greenery, water features, or street games) to refining designs through real-time data, AI is enabling cities to learn from themselves.

As Ratti often recalls from Buckminster Fuller, "we are all crew members aboard Spaceship Earth." The task before architects and urbanists is to steer that vessel wisely. Drawing from his experience leading the MIT Senseable City Lab and directing the 2025 Venice Architecture Biennale, Ratti will show how data, design, and collective intelligence can converge to create adaptive, responsive, and human-centred urban environments—from optimizing traffic flow and lighting systems to crafting public spaces that breathe, listen, and evolve.

Doxiadis and His Environment. A study tour exploring the theories, works, and legacy of Constantinos A. Doxiadis

Taking place on 13–14 June 2026 in Athens and the wider region of Attica, this two-day study tour traces the environments that shaped Constantinos Doxiadis's thinking and those that, in turn, were shaped by him. Participants will visit from historic landscapes and ancient sites that inspired his vision for the modern city and urban space — such as the Acropolis, the subject of his doctoral thesis reflecting Dimitris Pikionis's ideas — to the spaces Doxiadis designed, inhabited and worked, including his home, his office building and Apolloneio, his seaside development and personal retreat.

This thematic section will be about light, natural or artificial, and its mobilization within sculptural, urban, performative, or scenographic works. What mysterious power enables light to both reveal and blur our perception of space and time? How does it come into play to shape ambiences, situations, and environments? In what ways is it linked to shadow and opacity? Often associated with security, how does it fit into different surveillance and law-enforcement regimes? It also bears the potential for playfulness; how does it help to generate enchantment, surprise, or amusement? Although, as Jonathan Crary pointed out in 24/7 (2013), the development of natural-gas and electric lighting was part of the capitalist project to extend hours of production, what relationship does light retain with the creation of value? And how can we use it responsibly in a context of climate crisis and biodiversity decline? These questions may be explored through research on recent works in which light plays an important role.

gta papers: Demolitions

Deadline: Nov 30, 2025

Demolitions have often been framed in architectural history as spectacular narrative moments: the implosions of large-scale buildings, the clearing of "obsolete" modernist icons, or the large-scale operations of urban renewal, including infamous domicides, urbicides or acts of ruination. In the current global context where genocidal action and warfare systematically destroy lives, archives and architectures, designed destructions or demolitions continue to erase social and material landscapes, demanding a critical reflection in academic discourses.

Contributions from a wide variety of time periods and geographies might explore paradoxes such as preservation efforts that simultaneously erase everyday architectures, the belated recognition of works by women architects that have been lost, or the partial survival of structures that unsettle colonial histories. Submissions may also engage with methodological challenges and opportunities, ranging from the scarcity of material sources to experimental approaches for documenting complex cases. Image-based contributions are welcome that trace, reclaim, and contest both institutionalized and non-institutionalized archival materials, particularly endangered objects, images, and documents.
